

# CONSULTATION BY THE CIVIL PROCEDURE RULE COMMITTEE (CPRC)

## ACCESS TO COURT DOCUMENTS BY NON-PARTIES: PROPOSED NEW CPR 5.4C

### **Overview & Background**

This consultation was commissioned at the CPRC meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 (the <u>minutes</u> of which can be read online following careful consideration by a multi-jurisdictional working group, chaired by a Lord Justice of Appeal. The origins of the work flow from the UK Supreme Court judgment in <u>Cape Intermediate Holdings Ltd -v- Dring [2019] UKSC 38</u> (see specifically, paragraphs 41-51 inclusive) and the consultation is also set in the context of the Lady Chief Justice's broader agenda of looking at transparency issues. The 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 CPRC meeting also noted the possibility of an amendment, in due course, to CPR 32.13 (availability of witness statements for inspection) to provide express provision in relation to the inspection of expert reports.
